

A former top 10, Joshna Chinappa caused the first massive upset of the tournament ousting World No.23 Mélissa Alves, Ranked 314 this week, the Indian made the main draw in Monaco thanks to a pegged ranking after being sidelined for a year due to a knee injury. We thought she might break down when the Frenchwoman levelled after a fierce 4th game, on the contrary she was rock solid in the business end. In the quarters, Chinappa will face World No.44 Alicia Mead from England.


I just wanted to enjoy

become wiser!"








# Evans in control




