


MURPHY BACK IN THE FINAL

Picking up where she left off at the end of her quarter against Hana Ismail, Lucy Turmel got off to a flying start and deservedly clinched the first game against Tesni Murphy. But as she usually does, the Welshwoman started mixing things up, and hurt her opponent with the variety of her shots. Despite a brave fight back at the end of the 4th game, Turmel surrendered and lost her title, while Murphy will play another final 6 years after losing to Laura Massaro.





"I still love learning, and I never stopped trying new things. I am lucky to have Alison Waters as my coach, her game was very different to mine and I am taking some of her shots – for example the crosscourt kills which worked well today – and I am also trying to have more options with my forehand. Except during a period a couple of years ago when I

Yes I have only one title, when I started I didn't manage to win the small events and then it was all about going up in the rankings. And to be honest the tour is so strong these days, it's incredibly hard to win a tournament ...

After dominating the start, the Englishwoman had to work hard to overcome her very resilient opponent, who saved 3 match balls before surrendering in the 4th game tie-break.








Ranked 314 in the world this week, Joshna Chinappa is going to make a giant rise, the points she got in Monaco will propel her around 150.
